

A Lament

A structured way to bring pain somewhere.

A large part of the Psalter is lament: structured complaint, named honestly, brought before God. You do not have to resolve anything; the point is to give the pain a form and a witness. This worksheet walks through five movements lament has traditionally taken. Address it where you address it.

Address

Who or what you are bringing this to.

Complaint

What is hurting, said honestly. No softening required.

A Lament (continued)

Request

What you are asking for. Specific or general; both are faithful.

Trust

What still holds, even now. Or what you wish still held.

Vow, or Listening

What you carry forward from this prayer. Or where you sit, attentive, waiting for God to answer.

Lament does not require resolution. Some prayers move from words into listening. That is also faithful.
